BIRD WATCHERS



Charlotte Harbor and the Gulf Islands in Florida offer a unique attraction for those who love to watch birds. More than 190 species of birds frequent these regions, which are a part of the Great Florida Birding Trail, and the North American Migratory

Flyway. The desert beaches and mangrove-shaded rivers offer a rich habitat for both year-round and migratory birds. The wetlands and marshes are teeming with herons, egrets and woodpeckers, just to name a few. Many endangered species also find harbor here.

Accommodations near the area start at \$190 per night at Fishermen’s Village for a small villa. For \$200 a night you can rent a vacation home in Boca Grande, and for \$320 a night you can stay at Palm Island Resort where many special nature and birding programs are offered. Guided kayak trips will take you through calm shady rivers to see thousands of birds and sometimes an occasional dolphin or manatee. It’s not just birds in this huge wildlife reserve; there are also many species of fish, reptiles and mammals to see.
