There are various types of auditors, including information technology auditors, corporate auditors, environmental auditors, and compliance auditors. Many companies only require auditor job candidates to have four-year degrees in auditing-related disciplines along with relevant experience, but some prefer candidates with master's degrees.

"In this market it is extremely hard to get a job with a recruiter, and recruiters typically work with very few companies," says A. Harrison Barnes, founder and CEO of AuditorCrossing. "Job openings that are not widely known or publicized are the easiest jobs to get."
