Average Biotech Assistant Salaries

The average salary for biotech assistants varies greatly by company and location. To come up with the average salary, one agency just totaled all the salaries for any biotech listing and averaged them together. This might not be the most accurate tally for assistants because it includes all biotech jobs. The recruiters at Simply Hired estimated the salary to be around \$45,000 annually.
