



As Demand for Medium-Skilled Workers Increases, EmploymentCrossing Adds More Jobs for Mid-Level Professionals

According to the TWA report, the average salary for manufacturing professionals was \$50,000 in 2005 and is projected to increase by about 4% every year through 2010. “We have also noticed a slight bump in the salaries offered by employers for manufacturing professionals,” adds Barnes.
