Do you know how to tell the difference between the websites that list jobs?

- **Private Job Boards:** This is the category for EmploymentCrossing.com. A Private Job Board is usually restricted to members. The jobs on this private job board come from anywhere a job exists in cyberspace or in newspapers. EmploymentCrossing.com also searches out jobs posted to public job boards and to hardcopy. A. The largest difference when using a private job board is that jobs from all sources are posted and there is less competition for each position.
- **Public Job Boards:** Job Lists are available to anyone who has access to the internet. There is no membership needed to access these jobs that employers pay to have posted. They are free to all. Job hunters are never charged because the public job board serves the employer and he is the client. The employer pays a nice fee to post his job needs. The only jobs posted are those which an employer pays the public job board to post.
- **Employer Websites:** These are the company websites managed by the businesses where they can advertise current job openings for their company. All postings the company wants to do for job candidates is free on their own website. Usually the only job postings are for the company which owns the website. There are thousands of these employer websites and it would take lots of research time to find the postings. A. Harrison Barnes has a supercomputer database that searches and posts all these hidden treasures that no one else finds. The jobs are then posted to his Private Job Board, EmploymentCrossing.com.

Do you really know which job board to choose when there are so many job search sites to join?

Look for a website like EmploymentCrossing.com managed by CEO, A. Harrison Barnes. His websites are job seeker driven and not employer driven. This means, find out who is paying for the service. If the employer is paying to post on the job board, the search site is serving the employer and that is who the job board serves. Hot List - Below are the jobs you have saved to your hotlist. To apply for a job, simply check the corresponding box and click "Apply." You will then be asked to select your resume and cover letter. If you would like to apply for multiple jobs at the same time, simply check all appropriate boxes and click "Apply." When applying for multiple jobs, you will be required to use the same resume and cover letter for each job.

Access all the jobs save to hot list and create a batch that allows you to apply for multiple jobs at one time.
