

Payroll firm reports week private-sector job market for June

Pasadena, CA — ADP Employer Services, one of the nation's largest payroll administrators, reported that in June private employers added just 13,000 jobs. Before the report was released, analysts were expecting that the firm would report job gains of around 60,000.

The firm's report comes ahead of the federal government's own much more comprehensive non-farm labor market report that is going to be released on Friday. It is expected to show a job loss of around 115,000 in June.

But EmploymentCrossing CEO, A. Harrison Barnes is optimistic over the job outlook. EmploymentCrossing is a job aggregator and has been able to compile over 347,000 jobs in the last seven days alone. "I know all the big institute reports keep painting a dire picture of the job market, but my research team keeps coming up with thousands of new jobs every week, all over the country."

The sectors with the highest number of new openings this week are: healthcare (109,346), engineering (21,686), managerial (46,954), sales (36,790), and information technology (34,424).
