Healthcare HR jobs may involve constant monitoring of high security clearance employees such as doctors, nurses and pharmacists, while also dealing with lower level aides, cafeteria workers and receptionists. In addition, the healthcare field employees are now exposed to many diseases in recent years that weren't of concern previously. Making sure proper training on handling of bodily fluids, contaminated supplies and bedding are a constant monitoring job of the healthcare human resource department.
