That's because when a company receives enough applications to look at, the listing is taken off the job sites.

Of course there are and it is highly recommended that in addition to using an Internet listing job site, you should use some off line methods as well. Direct mail is an excellent method for looking for jobs. With direct mail, first you identify potential employers who may be looking for the position you are seeking. The first step in executing a direct mail program

is that you need to identify possible [manufacturing](#) companies who are looking for new employees. One of the best sources of finding manufacturing companies in your area is to use some online manufacturing directories. There is one manufacturing directory that extensively covers manufacturing companies that you may want to consider.

When you do find manufacturing jobs, you should also make sure you are prepared for the interview in the best way. First, you should wear a suit to the interview and look neat and well kempt. In addition to looking neat when you arrive at the place of potential employment you should treat everyone cheerfully and with respect — that starts from the receptionist and obviously would include the person who interviews you. Also after the interview you should follow up with a thank you note immediately. Most people never do that and that's
