Between 2000 and 2004 the number of workers in part-time management or professional occupations grew from 5.7 million to 6.4 million, as reported by *US News & World Report*. *US News & World Report* also cites a new study by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation that suggests that part-time work won't lead to a dead-end career. The study followed more than 80 part-time professionals between 1996 and 2003. Most received at least one promotion and received pay increases comparable to those of workers who returned to full-time status.

Part-time jobs can be great options for people looking for flexible employment. But the difficult part is getting started. Since these jobs are not advertised much, it can be difficult to find the right job matching one's interests and requirements.
